RE:	Engine Braking Ordinance

<u>Issue:</u> A request was received for the passage of an ordinance prohibiting the use of engine brakes at the intersection of County Trunk Highway V and State Highway 48, as well as the installation of signage stating that engine brakes are prohibited.

<u>Background</u>: The following email was forwarded on to County Board Chairman Louie Okey and he has inquired whether the County has an ordinance covering this and/or if this is something that the County deals with.

"The amount of engine braking and the excessive, undesirable noise it is producing at County Road V and State Hwy 48 has produced an undesirable impact on our business in the form of customer complaints and loss of revenue. There is no steep downgrade for truckers to contend with, therefore, the implementation and enforcement of such an ordinance would not have a detrimental safety impact in this area. Other Wisconsin townships and communities have installed signage on county roads and highways to address noise concerns associated with use of compression braking so there is precedence to follow.

I would like to request that the Town of Cedar Lake consider the following:

- 1. Implementing an ordinance prohibiting the use of engine brakes at the corner of County Road V and State Hwy 48.
- 2. Obtaining and installing signage to the effect that engine brakes are prohibited at the intersection."

Discussion:

With regard to the question of whether the County has this type of ordinance in effect, the answer is no it does not. Before turning to the discussion of developing such an ordinance I am going to refer to the policy the Wisconsin Department of Transportation has developed in responding for requests for placement of Engine Braking Prohibited signs

on the State Highway system. This does not control what is enacted at the local level, but is instructional regarding how the state handles this issue. The WisDOT policy is attached as Attachment A listed as **2-2-30 Engine Brake Signing**. Also attached as Attachment B is Wisconsin Statute Sec. 347.39 which is referenced in the WisDOT policy.

There are a few things to note in the WisDOT policy. First, the local jurisdiction wishing to place a sign on the State Highway must obtain a permit to do so and make the request in writing providing the specific information requested to allow the state to determine whether to issue the permit. The additional requirements are that the local government shall be responsible for supplying, installing and maintaining the signs. The local government must be committed to actively enforce the requirements of the signs with local law enforcement personnel, and they must use the standard sign with required language.

This last point requires that the signs state "ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED", and not the formally used sign of "No Engine Braking" or "Engine Braking Prohibited". This is an interesting change which I will discuss further below.

Something else noteworthy in the WisDOT policy is the sign placement. It provides that "Only the standard ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED sign (R10-64) may be used on highways under state maintenance responsibility and these signs *may* be installed only on conventional highways at or near the corporate limits of the community. The signs **shall not** be used on freeways, expressways, interchange ramps, or site-specific locations on conventional highways."

The key points I drew from the WisDOT policy that will assist our analysis would be to be: (1) "committed to actively enforce the requirements of the sign with local law enforcement personnel"; (2) the change in language to "ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED"; and (3) the location be only on conventional highways at or near corporate limits and not for site-specific locations.

Analysis:

As with any ordinance that is adopted by the County Board, there should be an element of enforcement. That is, how do you achieve compliance with the requirements of the ordinance – its teeth. Normally, that is done with the requirement to pay a forfeiture if you violate the terms of the ordinance. So, the question becomes, how do you enforce an "Engine Braking Prohibited" ordinance? You would have to catch the person in the act and prove that they engaged their engine brakes in violation of the ordinance. Is there a level of noise that is unacceptable? Does the Deputy need to have a decibel meter? Do we also need a noise ordinance component? Can they argue that it was an emergency?

I suspect that these issues with enforcement might be part of the reason for the change in language to "Engine Brake Mufflers Required". Then law enforcement can rely on section 347.39 Wis. Stats. to issue a citation; however, they would still need to catch the offender in the act and then determine that the muffler was defective.

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There has been some discussion about simply putting up the sign and not enforcing it, perhaps without even passing an ordinance. I do not believe this is an advisable course of action. If there is going to be a sign placed restricting an activity then it must be placed with the authority of an underlying ordinance and the local government should be prepared to enforce it. The WisDOT policy makes this a specific requirement to issuing a permit and any local ordinance should be with the commitment to enforce it.

The third point from the state policy was location. It required that the location be only on conventional highways at or near corporate limits and not for site-specific locations. The policy does provide for signs for urbanized townships and gives an additional list of requirements that do not apply here. The location being requested here is not at or near corporate limits. It certainly would be for a site-specific location.


<u>Conclusion</u>: As was stated at the onset, Barron County does not have an Engine Braking Ordinance. That is not to say that there are not Engine Braking signs on the roadway, but these for the most part are on State Highways leading in to a municipality. If any exist on the County Trunk Highway system they have been place without authorization or have been there for a long time and are not enforced. Additionally, there have been very few, if any, requests for Engine Braking Prohibited signs on the county system.

Ultimately, it would be up to the Highway Committee to recommend and the County Board to approve an Ordinance after weighing the necessity of such an ordinance. If that is to be recommended it should be the "ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED" language rather than the "ENGINE BRAKES PROHIBITED" language. I would additionally advise that the Highway Committee weigh carefully the need for this type of ordinance and consider not only the difficulty in enforcement, but also consider whether there will be enforcement. If there is not a commitment to enforce the ordinance I would recommend not passing it if only a sign will be place.

Lastly, consideration should be given to location. The request that prompted this discussion is for a site-specific location. Other than zoning amendments (which is required by state law) it is not good policy to pass an ordinance for one specific location. Granted, the ordinance could be written to give the Highway Commissioner or the Highway Committee the authority to grant future requests for placing "ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED" signs; however, the fact remains that we have had very limited requests of that nature and the present request is for a site-specific location.

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2-2-30 Engine Brake Signing

January 2018

PURPOSE

One method of slowing the motion of a vehicle is to use the compression of the engine as part of vehicle braking. This method is often referred to as compression braking or exhaust braking. Engine braking can produce excessive, undesirable noise when muffler systems are not functioning as designed or are otherwise inadequate.

Noise from engine braking in vehicles with inadequate muffler systems has led some communities to take actions to restrict the noise. Compression braking is typically an unavoidable result of operating a vehicle that the driver cannot prevent or fully disengage. However, for some vehicles there are driver choices as to whether or when engine compression braking is used. Objectionable noise levels *may* be produced by any car or truck when using compression braking and often are related to equipment failure or aftermarket modifications.

There are several advantages to compression braking on vehicles and especially on large trucks. In addition to assisting deceleration, when a truck engine brake system is engaged, it helps prevent the conventional truck air brakes from overheating, thus saving on the normal wearing life of the truck air brakes. This is especially true on roadways with steep downgrades with long distances, where the safety of the truck can be enhanced using engine brakes.

Communities have installed or requested signing on state highways to address noise concerns associated with use of compression braking. The Department controls traffic signs on highways maintained by the state. Local governments do not have the authority to erect signs on those highways except when written permission is provided by the Department.

The Department supports efforts to deal with excessive noise from all vehicles and encourages enforcement of laws requiring effective mufflers (for example, <u>State Statute Section 347.39</u>). The use of signs specific to engine or compression braking has become popular among many communities, although it is unclear whether those signs are effective or necessary. Generally, the Department does not allow installation of traffic signs on state highways that have not been shown to be necessary or effective. In the case of engine braking, the Department has chosen to work with communities and allow limited use of these signs on state highways under certain conditions, despite the lack of evidence that they are effective in reducing noise problems.

POLICY

The Department may permit local governments to place signs on highways under WisDOT jurisdiction subject to

the requirements included here:

- 1. Requests for a permit to allow these signs must be in writing to the WisDOT Regional Office and *should* contain the following information
 - a. Locations where signs are to be installed, including state highway route number and distance to the nearest public roadway intersection
 - b. Sign offset (distance from edge of travel lane) and type of post to be used
 - c. Assurance that sign will be free standing (not attached to other signs)
- 2. The local government shall be responsible for supplying, installing, and maintaining the signs in
- conformance with the permit. The local government shall furnish their identification sticker on the sign.The local government must be committed to actively enforce the requirements of the signs with local law enforcement personnel.
- 4. Only the standard ENGINE BRAKE MUFFLERS REQUIRED sign (R10-64) may be used on highways under state maintenance responsibility and those signs may be installed only on conventional highways at or near the corporate limits of the community (see Figure 1). This sign **shall not** be used on freeways, expressways, interchange ramps, or site-specific locations on conventional highways.
 - a. For freeway locations going through communities, engine brake signs *may* be permitted on conventional state highways after the entry point to the conventional highway from the freeway, provided signs are already approved at the city/village limits.
 - b. Engine brake signs may be allowed for urbanized townships provided they have the means to enforce it. Documentation shall be provided by the local law enforcement indicating that the ordinance will be enforced throughout the township. Urbanized townships are defined by having at least two of the following features:
 - i. Urban cross section
 - ii. Residential development abutting the highway that meets the definition of "semi urban district" as defined in Wisconsin State Statutes 346.57(1)(b)
 - iii. Reduced speed zone
 - iv. Qualify for an unincorporated community sign.

For qualifying urban townships, only 1 sign is allowed in each direction on any given state highway. The signs **shall** be installed at the township limits.

- c. The local government must obtain the approval of the appropriate Regional office for the location of the sign. The sign language **shall** meet the requirements of the WisDOT R10-64 sign plate as described in item 4.
- d. Any other signs related to use of engine braking installed on highways under WisDOT jurisdiction within or for the local government that do not meet the requirements of this policy should be replaced by the local government, as opportunities arise (knockdowns, improvement projects or replacement due to age) to comply with this policy.

2-2-35 Littering Signs

September 2000

PURPOSE

The intent of this guideline is to eliminate signs that inform the public about fines for littering since the signs are not necessary for the guidance or warning of traffic.

Signs with the message \$500 FINE FOR THROWING LITTER OR TRASH ON HIGHWAYS KEEP WISCONSIN CLEAN (R5-56) have been installed on state highways in the past. The purpose of these signs was to discourage littering and to reinforce to motorists the maximum statutory fine for littering on highways. While littering has the potential to create safety hazards as well as diminishing the quality of state highways, there is reason to believe that usage of these signs has a minimal effect on curbing littering problems. The State Patrol has mentioned that these signs have little effect on the motoring public, the law is very difficult to enforce, and citations have very rarely been given out. The State Patrol does not object to removing these signs. Due to

347.39 Mufflers.

- (1) No person shall operate on a highway any motor vehicle subject to registration unless such motor vehicle is equipped with an adequate muffler in constant operation and properly maintained to prevent any excessive or unusual noise or annoying smoke. This subsection also applies to motor bicycles.
- (2) No muffler or exhaust system on any vehicle mentioned in sub. (1) shall be equipped with a cutout, bypass or similar device nor shall there be installed in the exhaust system of any such vehicle any device to ignite exhaust gases so as to produce flame within or without the exhaust system. No person shall modify the exhaust system of any such motor vehicle in a manner which will amplify or increase the noise emitted by the motor of such vehicle above that emitted by the muffler originally installed on the vehicle, and such original muffler shall comply with all the requirements of this section.
- (3) In this section, "muffler" means a device consisting of a series of chambers of baffle plates or other mechanical design for receiving exhaust gases from an internal combustion engine and which is effective in reducing noise.
