We are grateful for your past support of Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Association (WI Land+Water), which has allowed us to continue to evolve into one of the most effective conservation organizations in the state. Going forward, we pledge to continue to serve and represent your department and your committee by providing the highest level of service. As such, I would like to ask you to please consider renewing your membership with WI Land+Water in 2023. An invoice indicating forthcoming dues for 2023 membership is attached.

In the past year, your Association has acted as a strong voice for county conservation, ensuring elected officials understand the value and importance of our shared work, and continuing to build practical partnerships with agricultural and conservation groups alike, in support of our conservation priorities.

WI Land+Water is proud of our 2022 accomplishments. Some highlights include:

- Hosting our 69th Annual Conference, virtually attended by over 300 conservation professionals and highlighted by a keynote address from North Dakota farmer and soil health specialist Jay Fuhrer.
- Expanding our Conservation Training Program membership services by adding a new staff Statewide Training Coordinator position, funded by USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service.
- Bolstering farm landscapes and livelihoods to withstand extreme weather events through our Climate Resilience Program. Along with other partners, our staff worked to plant 1,100 trees on a Monroe County farm, providing co-benefits that sequester carbon, increase animal comfort, build soil, and improve water infiltration. Similar work will occur in the coming years, supported by funding from the McKnight Foundation.
- Transitioning our newsletters to an electronic format that enjoys wide readership, allowing us to reach more people in telling the good stories of county conservation in action.
- Convening with "nontraditional" partners to advance our conservation policy goals, via the "Clean Water Initiative," where we are collectively pursuing policy and legislative solutions to achieving clean water and resilient farms.
- Acting as a member of the Inter-Agency Water Quality Steering Group, comprised of leaders from the Wisconsin departments of Natural Resources and Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, and UW-Madison Division of Extension.

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- With DATCP support, WI Land+Water's Conservation Training Program provided professional development and training opportunities to over 3,500 participants through holding over 40 webinars, 15 in-person trainings, and supporting 11 Area Interagency Training Committee trainings, as well as 23 SITCOM Conservation Training e-newsletters.
- Made exciting strides with our Youth Education Program, hosting a virtual Conservation Awareness Poster and Speaking Contest, a "hybrid" Wisconsin Envirothon, and launching a new conservation camp for middle schoolers, in partnership with UW Division of Extension's Upham Woods.
- The Standards Oversight Council (SOC) program, coordinated by WI Land+Water, continued to serve as an innovative model for facilitating the development of technical conservation standards. In 2022, we completed the DNR 1072 Horizontal Directional Drilling standard and facilitated related training. SOC teams are currently working on improvements to NRCS standards for conservation crop rotation and windbreaks and the creation of a new DNR standard for enhanced dry treatment systems. SOC also launched a new website to better communicate ongoing progress.

In 2023, decision-makers in Wisconsin will continue to examine legislative and policy approaches toward pressing issues such as water quality improvement, farmland and working lands preservation, and building a more resilient landscape. They will also determine via the 2023-25 state biennial budget the amount of financial support to provide to county conservation department staff, and related conservation programs. It is a critically important time for us to present a consistent, unified voice in advocating for locally led conservation.

With the support of your membership dues payment, WI Land+Water can continue to provide the resources and support needed to implement the local priorities identified in your Land and Water Resource Management Plan, and can promote (at both the federal and state levels) LCCs and LCDs as the primary local delivery mechanism to bring conservation practices to the land and landowners.
