Meeting called to order by Judge James Babler at 12:01 p.m. Public meeting notification read by Babler. Motion Okey/Schmidt to approve agenda. Motion carried. Motion French/Roux to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Babler presented all data reports. Council discussed. Evenson gave jail update. Council discussed. Schmidt explains probation holds/revocation. Nelson explains legal representation conflicts/shortage in Barron County and statewide. Council discussed.

Judge Boyle gave Drug and Alcohol Court update. Currently has waitlist and 14-16 participants at this time. Treatment Team now includes a Recovery Coach. Stated court session is open to public, encouraged others to attend. Hay updated council on 2024 TAD Grant. Stated Barron County was awarded \$200,000 total (\$150,000 state, \$50,000 match) Stated funds are used for additional treatment, conferences and trainings. Stated grant allows Barron County to continue to use best practices while providing treatment to participants. Boyle stated conference attendance has already led to positive improvements for participants.

Babler gave update on Branch 2 Judge. Stated one individual is currently running. Stated Barron County could have Branch 2 vacancy filled by June 2024.


Hagen gave methamphetamine update. State caseload remains even. Evenson stated use of electronic monitoring slightly raised. Explained use of electronic monitoring.


Future agenda items: Barron County Jail Demographic and Wisconsin state comparison. Mental Health Workgroup update.










Barron County March 2024 Bail Jumping Charges












Barron County 2024 Hold Over Summary



In March 2024, 70 cases were closed. Of those cases, 15 defendants were sentenced to probation in 16 cases and three defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision.


Of the 16 cases:


- 3 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 8 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 4 defendants ordered three years of probation
- 1 defendant ordered four years of probation

In April 2024, 73 cases were closed. Of those cases, 21 defendants were sentenced to probation in 24 cases.

Of the 24 cases:


- 8 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 8 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 6 defendants ordered three years of probation
- 2 defendants ordered five years of probation
- 1 defendant ordered ten years of probation










March 2024 Summary 75 Total Inmates

















April 2024 Summary 133 Total Inmates















March 2024 Jail Demographic Comparison Barron, Polk, Dunn, Chippewa, Eau Claire









