Meeting called to order by Judge James Babler at 11:59 a.m. Public meeting notification read by Babler. Motion Okey/Roux to approve agenda moving #6 to top.

Babler presented Barron County Family Recovery Court short video. Council discussed. Babler presented number of children in out-of-home placement in Barron County from 2018 to present date. Council discussed. Stated participation in Family Recovery Court is voluntary. Stated court is held every two weeks. Stated there is a team staffing and in court face-to-face time with each participant. Council discussed.

Karla Broten, Youth and Families Program Manager with Barron County DHHS, presented process of enrollment in Family Recovery Court. Stated potential participants are introduced to program and presented with video at meetings with social worker. Council discussed.

Motion Millermon/Evenson to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Fitzgerald presented all data reports. Coordinator explained new breakdown for probation holds on jail data reports. Council discussed.

Coordinator presented 2025 TAD Grant update. Stated Barron County received \$150,000 from state, and \$50,000 required match from Barron County. Stated some restrictions with incentives being funded by the state this year. Stated treatment team is working on alternatives. Turcott asked if grant funds trainings. Coordinator stated grant covers trainings at no additional expense to Barron County.


Fitzgerald stated a report will be released soon addressing methamphetamine updates in Barron County.



























In January 2025, 92 cases were closed. Of those cases, 16 defendants were sentenced to probation in 19 cases and five defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision in six cases.

#### Of the 19 cases:

- 2 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 8 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 4 defendants ordered three years of probation
- 5 defendants ordered five years of probation

In February 2025, 81 cases were closed. Of those cases, 25 defendants were sentenced to probation in 28 cases and two defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision in seven cases. One defendant is eligible for expunction.

#### Of the 28 cases:

- 9 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 1 defendant ordered 18 months of probation
- 9 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 9 defendants ordered three years of probation

In March 2025, 73 cases were closed. Of those cases, 12 defendants were sentenced to probation in 16 cases and four defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision in seven cases. One defendant is eligible for expunction.


#### Of the 16 cases:


- 8 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 7 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 1 defendant ordered three years of probation


In April 2025, 63 cases were closed. Of those cases, 15 defendants were sentenced to probation in 16 cases and eight defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision in nine cases.


#### Of the 16 cases:


- 2 defendants ordered one year of probation

- 1 defendant ordered eight years of probation
















January 2025 Summary 123 Total Inmates



















February 2025 Summary 91 Total Inmates
















March 2025 Summary 117 Total Inmates


