RE: Jail Sally Port and Videoconferencing

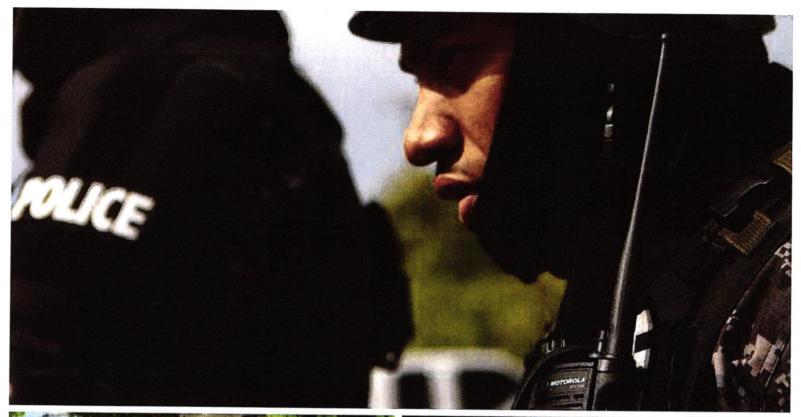
When the current Barron County Jail opened in 2004, the courts did not use videoconferencing, nor was it fiscally feasible to use such a system at the time. When costs for such equipment became more affordable and when other entities began using such equipment, videoconferencing was added to the courts. At that time, the courts could only use video with other sites that had similar equipment.

The courts began to use video for bail hearings and mental commitments around 2015. It wasn't until the COVID crisis in 2020 and the advent of the widespread use of Zoom that video was easily affordable and accessible to anyone with a smartphone or computer. The Barron County Circuit Courts now use Zoom for more that 50% of all hearings.

The Judges learned a year ago that many lawyers would not take Public Defender cases here because the Barron County jail did not allow them to have contact with their clients by Zoom. We learned that the reason for the problem was that the 2 video stations that the Jail had were in almost constant use for court proceedings for the Barron County Judges and for Judges in other counties, especially the ones where Barron County was renting space for out-of-county prisoners

Most criminal defendants are represented by the Public Defender's Office and when the office has a conflict, it appoints private attorneys. There is an alarming shortage of attorneys in northwest Wisconsin and no attorney in Barron County will take a Public Defender case. Attorneys from outside of Barron County will take Public Defender cases as long as they can do most of the hearings by Zoom and they can contact their clients in the jail by Zoom.

The new jail sally port project will also include 4 rooms with videoconferencing equipment. The new video rooms are crucial to getting attorneys to take Barron County criminal cases and keep our criminal justice system running smoothly.

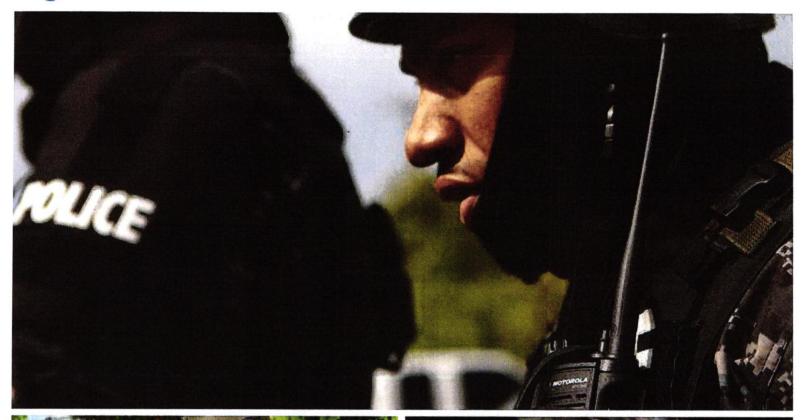

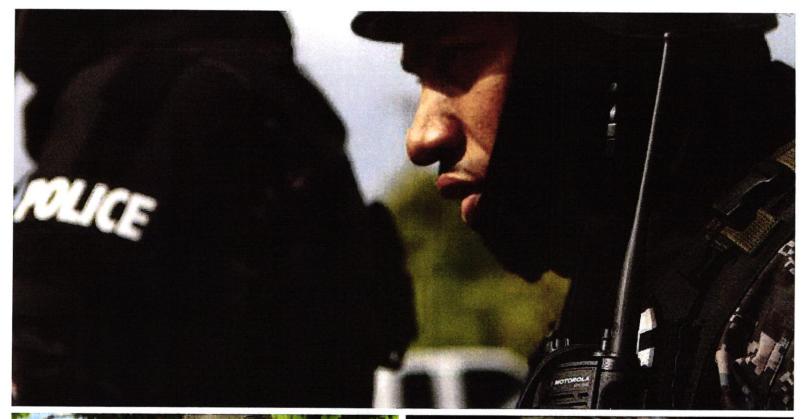

Lessor will have all legal and equitable rights and remedies to take possession of the Equipment. Non-appropriation of funds shall not constitute a default hereunder for purposes of Section 16.

6. LESSEE CERTIFICATION. Lessee represents, covenants and warrants that: (i) Lessee is a state or a duly constituted political subdivision or agency of the state of the Equipment Location; (ii) the interest portion of the Lease Payments shall be excludable from Lessor's gross income pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as it may be amended from time to time (the "Code"); (iii) the execution, delivery and performance by the Lessee of this Lease have been duly authorized by all necessary action on the part of the Lessee; (iv) this Lease constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of the Lessee enforceable in accordance with its terms; (v) Lessee will comply with the information reporting requirements of Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code"), and such compliance shall include but not be limited to the execution of information statements requested by Lessor; (vi) Lessee will not do or cause to be done any act which will cause, or by omission of any act allow, the Lease to be an arbitrage bond within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code; (vii) Lessee will not do or cause to be done any act which will cause, or by omission of any act allow, the interest portion of the Lease Payment to be or become includible in gross income for Federal income taxation purposes under the Code; and (ix) Lessee will be the only entity to own, use and operate the Equipment during the Lease Term.

Lessee represents, covenants and warrants that: (i) it will do or cause to be done all things necessary to preserve and keep the Lease in full force and effect, (ii) it has complied with all laws relative to public bidding where necessary, and (iii) it has sufficient appropriations or other funds available to pay all amounts due hereunder for the current fiscal period.

If Lessee breaches the covenant contained in this Section, the interest component of Lease Payments may become includible in gross income of the owner or owners thereof for federal income tax purposes. In such event, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Section 11 of this Agreement, Lessee agrees to pay promptly after any such determination of taxability and on each Lease Payment date thereafter to Lessor an additional amount determined by Lessor to compensate such owner or owners for the loss of such excludibility (including, without limitation, compensation relating to interest expense, penalties or additions to tax), which determination shall be conclusive (absent manifest error). Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, any additional amount payable by Lessee pursuant to this Section 6 shall be payable solely from Legally Available Funds.

It is Lessor's and Lessee's intention that this Agreement not constitute a "true" lease for federal income tax purposes and, therefore, it is Lessor's and Lessee's intention that Lessee be considered the owner of the Equipment for federal income tax purposes.

- 7. TITLE TO EQUIPMENT. SECURITY INTEREST. Upon shipment of the Equipment to Lessee hereunder, title to the Equipment will vest in Lessee subject to any applicable license; provided, however, that (i) in the event of termination of this Lease by Lessee pursuant to Section 5 hereof; (ii) upon the occurrence of an Event of Default hereunder, and as long as such Event of Default is continuing; or (iii) in the event that the purchase option has not been exercised prior to the Expiration Date, title will immediately vest in Lessor or its Assignee, and Lessee shall immediately discontinue use of the Equipment, remove the Equipment from Lessee's computers and other electronic devices and deliver the Equipment to Lessor or its Assignee. In order to secure all of its obligations hereunder, Lessee hereby (i) grants to Lessor a first and prior security interest in any and all right, title and interest of Lessee in the Equipment and in all additions, attachments, accessions, and substitutions thereto, and on any proceeds therefrom; (ii) agrees that this Lease may be filed as a financing statement evidencing such security interest; and (iii) agrees to execute and deliver all financing statements, certificates of title and other instruments necessary or appropriate to evidence such security interest.
- 8. USE; REPAIRS. Lessee will use the Equipment in a careful manner for the use contemplated by the manufacturer of the Equipment and shall comply with all laws, ordinances, insurance policies, the Contract, any licensing or other agreement, and regulations relating to, and will pay all costs, claims, damages, fees and charges arising out of the possession, use or maintenance of the Equipment. Lessee, at its expense will keep the Equipment in good repair and furnish and/or install all parts, mechanisms, updates, upgrades and devices required therefor.
- **9. ALTERATIONS.** Lessee will not make any alterations, additions or improvements to the Equipment without Lessor's prior written consent unless such alterations, additions or improvements may be readily removed without damage to the Equipment.
- 10. LOCATION; INSPECTION. The Equipment will not be removed from, [or if the Equipment consists of rolling stock, its permanent base will not be changed from] the Equipment Location without Lessor's prior written consent which will not be unreasonably withheld. Lessor will be entitled to enter upon the Equipment Location or elsewhere during reasonable business hours to inspect the Equipment or observe its use and operation.
- 11. LIENS AND TAXES. Lessee shall keep the Equipment free and clear of all levies, liens and encumbrances except those created under this Lease. Lessee shall pay, when due, all charges and taxes (local, state and federal) which may now or hereafter be

imposed upon the ownership, licensing, leasing, rental, sale, purchase, possession or use of the Equipment, excluding however, all taxes on or measured by Lessor's income. If Lessee fails to pay said charges and taxes when due, Lessor shall have the right, but shall not be obligated, to pay said charges and taxes. If Lessor pays any charges or taxes, Lessee shall reimburse Lessor therefor within ten days of written demand.

12. RISK OF LOSS: DAMAGE; DESTRUCTION. Lessee assumes all risk of loss or damage to the Equipment from any cause whatsoever, and no such loss of or damage to the Equipment nor defect therein nor unfitness or obsolescence thereof shall relieve Lessee of the obligation to make Lease Payments or to perform any other obligation under this Lease. In the event of damage to any item of Equipment, Lessee will immediately place the same in good repair with the proceeds of any insurance recovery applied to the cost of such repair. If Lessor determines that any item of Equipment is lost, stolen, destroyed or damaged beyond repair (an "Event of Loss"), Lessee at the option of Lessor will: either (a) replace the same with like equipment in good repair; or (b) on the next Lease Payment date, pay Lessor the sum of: (i) all amounts then owed by Lessee to Lessor under this Lease, including the Lease payment due on such date; and (ii) an amount equal to all remaining Lease Payments to be paid during the Lease Term as set forth in Schedule B.

In the event that Lessee is obligated to make such payment with respect to less than all of the Equipment, Lessor will provide Lessee with the pro rata amount of the Lease Payment and the Balance Payment (as set forth in Schedule B) to be made by Lessee with respect to that part of the Equipment which has suffered the Event of Loss.

- 13. INSURANCE. Lessee will, at its expense, maintain at all times during the Lease Term, fire and extended coverage, public liability and property damage insurance with respect to the Equipment in such amounts, covering such risks, and with such insurers as shall be satisfactory to Lessor, or, with Lessor's prior written consent, Lessee may self-insure against any or all such risks. All insurance covering loss of or damage to the Equipment shall be carried in an amount no less than the amount of the then applicable Balance Payment with respect to such Equipment. The initial amount of insurance required is set forth in Schedule B. Each insurance policy will name Lessee as an insured and Lessor or it's Assigns as an additional insured, and will contain a clause requiring the insurer to give Lessor at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of any alteration in the terms of such policy or the cancellation thereof. The proceeds of any such policies will be payable to Lessee and Lessor or it's Assigns as their interests may appear. Upon acceptance of the Equipment and upon each insurance renewal date, Lessee will deliver to Lessor a certificate evidencing such insurance. In the event that Lessee has been permitted to self-insure, Lessee will furnish Lessor with a letter or certificate to such effect. In the event of any loss, damage, injury or accident involving the Equipment, Lessee will promptly provide Lessor with written notice thereof and make available to Lessor all information and documentation relating thereto.
- 14. INDEMNIFICATION. Lessee shall, to the extent permitted by law, indemnify Lessor against, and hold Lessor harmless from, any and all claims, actions, proceedings, expenses, damages or liabilities, including attorneys' fees and court costs, arising in connection with the Equipment, including, but not limited to, its selection, purchase, delivery, licensing, possession, use, operation, rejection, or return and the recovery of claims under insurance policies thereon.
- 15. ASSIGNMENT. Without Lessor's prior written consent, Lessee will not either (i) assign, transfer, pledge, hypothecate, grant any security interest in or otherwise dispose of this Lease or the Equipment or any interest in this Lease or the Equipment or; (ii) sublet or lend the Equipment or permit it to be used by anyone other than Lessee or Lessee's employees. Lessor may assign its rights, title and interest in and to this Lease, the Equipment and any documents executed with respect to this Lease and/or grant or assign a security interest in this Lease and the Equipment, in whole or in part. Any such assignees shall have all of the rights of Lessor under this Lease. Subject to the foregoing, this Lease inures to the benefit of and is binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

Lessee covenants and agrees not to assert against the Assignee any claims or defenses by way of abatement, setoff, counterclaim, recoupment or the like which Lessee may have against Lessor. No assignment or reassignment of any Lessor's right, title or interest in this Lease or the Equipment shall be effective unless and until Lessee shall have received a notice of assignment, disclosing the name and address of each such assignee; provided, however, that if such assignment is made to a bank or trust company as paying or escrow agent for holders of certificates of participation in the Lease, it shall thereafter be sufficient that a copy of the agency agreement shall have been deposited with Lessee until Lessee shall have been advised that such agency agreement is no longer in effect. During the Lease Term Lessee shall keep a complete and accurate record of all such assignments in form necessary to comply with Section 149(a) of the Code, and the regulations, proposed or existing, from time to time promulgated thereunder. No further action will be required by Lessor or by Lessee to evidence the assignment, but Lessee will acknowledge such assignments in writing if so requested.

After notice of such assignment, Lessee shall name the Assignee as additional insured and loss payee in any insurance policies obtained or in force. Any Assignee of Lessor may reassign this Lease and its interest in the Equipment and the Lease Payments to any other person who, thereupon, shall be deemed to be Lessor's Assignee hereunder.

16. EVENT OF DEFAULT. The term "Event of Default", as used herein, means the occurrence of any one or more of the following events: (i) Lessee fails to make any Lease Payment (or any other payment) as it becomes due in accordance with the terms of the Lease when funds have been appropriated sufficient for such purpose, and any such failure continues for ten (10) days after the due date thereof; (ii) Lessee fails to perform or observe any other covenant, condition, or agreement to be performed or observed by it hereunder and such failure is not cured within twenty (20) days after written notice thereof by Lessor; (iii) the discovery by Lessor that any statement, representation, or warranty made by Lessee in this Lease or in writing delivered by Lessee pursuant hereto or in connection herewith is false, misleading or erroneous in any material respect; (iv) proceedings under any bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization or similar legislation shall be instituted against or by Lessee, or a receiver or similar officer shall be appointed for Lessee or any of its property, and

such proceedings or appointments shall not be vacated, or fully stayed, within twenty (20) days after the institution or occurrence thereof; or (v) an attachment, levy or execution is threatened or levied upon or against the Equipment.

- 17. REMEDIES. Upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, and as long as such Event of Default is continuing, Lessor may, at its option, exercise any one or more of the following remedies: (i) by written notice to Lessee, declare all amounts then due under the Lease, and all remaining Lease Payments due during the fiscal period in effect when the default occurs to be immediately due and payable, whereupon the same shall become immediately due and payable; (ii) by written notice to Lessee, request Lessee to (and Lessee agrees that it will), at Lessee's expense, promptly discontinue use of the Equipment, remove the Equipment from all of Lessee's computers and electronic devices, return the Equipment to Lessor in the manner set forth in Section 5 hereof, or Lessor, at its option, may enter upon the premises where the Equipment is located and take immediate possession of and remove the same; (iii) sell or lease the Equipment or sublease it for the account of Lessee, holding Lessee liable for all Lease Payments and other amounts due prior to the effective date of such selling, leasing or subleasing and for the difference between the purchase price, rental and other amounts paid by the purchaser, Lessee or sublessee pursuant to such sale, lease or sublease and the amounts payable by Lessee hereunder; (iv) promptly return the Equipment to Lessor in the manner set forth in Section 5 hereof; and (v) exercise any other right, remedy or privilege which may be available to it under applicable laws of the state of the Equipment Location or any other applicable law or proceed by appropriate court action to enforce the terms of the Lease or to recover damages for the breach of this Lease or to rescind this Lease as to any or all of the Equipment. - 18. PURCHASE OPTION. Upon thirty (30) days prior written notice from Lessee to Lessor, and provided that no Event of Default has occurred and is continuing, or no event, which with notice or lapse of time, or both could become an Event of Default, then exists, Lessee will have the right to purchase the Equipment on the Lease Payment dates set forth in Schedule B by paying to Lessor, on such date, the Lease Payment then due together with the Balance Payment amount set forth opposite such date. Upon satisfaction by Lessee of such purchase conditions, Lessor will transfer any and all of its right, title and interest in the Equipment to Lessee as is, without warranty, express or implied, except that the Equipment is free and clear of any liens created by Lessor.
- 19. NOTICES. All notices to be given under this Lease shall be made in writing and mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested or sent electronically via email, to the other party at its address set forth herein or at such address as the party may provide in writing or electronically from time to time. If mailed, any such notice shall be deemed to have been received five days subsequent to such mailing.
- 20. SECTION HEADINGS. All section headings contained herein are for the convenience of reference only and are not intended to define or limit the scope of any provision of this Lease.
- 21. GOVERNING LAW. This Lease shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by the laws of, the state of the Equipment Location.
- 22. DELIVERY OF RELATED DOCUMENTS. Lessee will execute or provide, as requested by Lessor, such other documents and information as are reasonably necessary with respect to the transaction contemplated by this Lease.
- 23. ENTIRE AGREEMENT; WAIVER. This Lease, together with Schedule A Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement, Schedule B, Evidence of Insurance, Statement of Essential Use/Source of Funds, Certificate of Incumbency, Certified Lessee Resolution (if any), Information Return for Tax-Exempt Governmental Obligations and the Delivery and Acceptance Certificate and other attachments hereto, and other documents or instruments executed by Lessee and Lessor in connection herewith, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the Lease of the Equipment, and this Lease shall not be modified, amended, altered, or changed except with the written consent of Lessee and Lessor. Any provision of the Lease found to be prohibited by law shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remainder of the Lease.

The waiver by Lessor of any breach by Lessee of any term, covenant or condition hereof shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach thereof.

RE: Boat Replacement

For the past several years we have been discussing a more appropriate patrol boat to meet the demands of Law Enforcement duties while patroling the waters of Barron County. Over the past several years we have found our current patrol boat to be difficult to work out of due to its design. The bow deck is configured near the top of the gunwales posing officer safety concerns. While an officer is on the bow deck to maintain separation between two boats the officer needs to be on his knees and bent over to hold onto another boat. Additionally, with the dual console design and our MDC being mounted between the consoles, the bow deck is difficult to quickly access.

We have spent the past few years researching other options and have received pricing on several different makes/models. There are several companies that produce patrol boats that are specific to the needs of Law Enforcement, however, they come at a significant cost. We recently received pricing from Life Proof Boats as well as Lake Assault. Both of these options came in over \$300,000. Due to the high cost we began exploring other commercially available boats that, although not a perfect fit for Law Enforcement, came at a greatly reduced cost and will still be a much better fit for our needs than our current configuration.

At this time we feel that moving forward with a center console boat produced by Mako is our best option. The model that we have selected is the Mako 214CC, which is a 21-foot center console fishing boat. By moving to a center console configuration, officers will be able to walk down both sides of the boat without having to work around the dual console design of our past patrol boats. The Mako is available for order at Tracker Boat Center in Rice Lake which is convienent to have a dealer that can service the boat locally. We were quoted \$53,380 for a trade difference, however, this is not inclusive of all costs that will be associated with getting the patrol boat in running order for Law Enforcement. The boat will need to be equipped with sonar for search and rescue missions, as well as our emergency lights, MDC install, ect. Additionally the T-top will require some modifications to make it foldable to be able to clear some low bridges in the county. I anticipate a realistic expendature for this entire package to be in the area of \$75-80,000 after accounting for the trade in value of our 2021 Nitro boat.

Although this is still a significant cost, we are able to receive reimbursement for this purchase over the next 5 years through the WI DNR. Past years reimbursement rates have been between 70-75% so at the end of the 5 year depreciation the value of the boat is significantly higher than the unreimbursed costs.

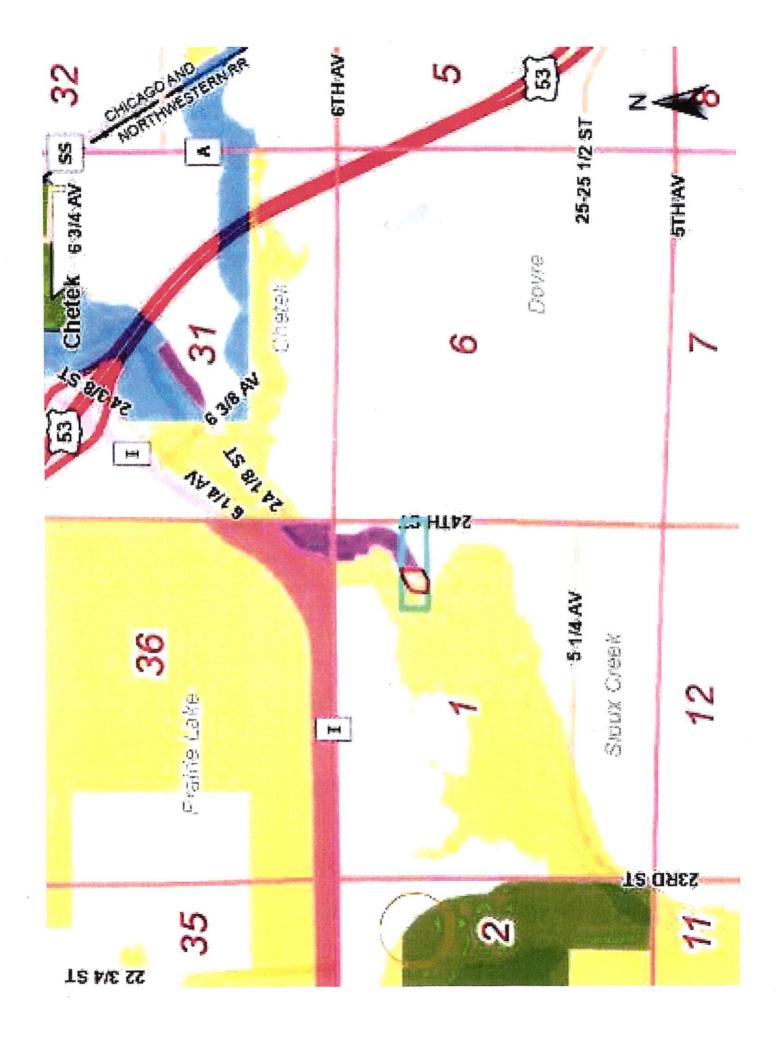

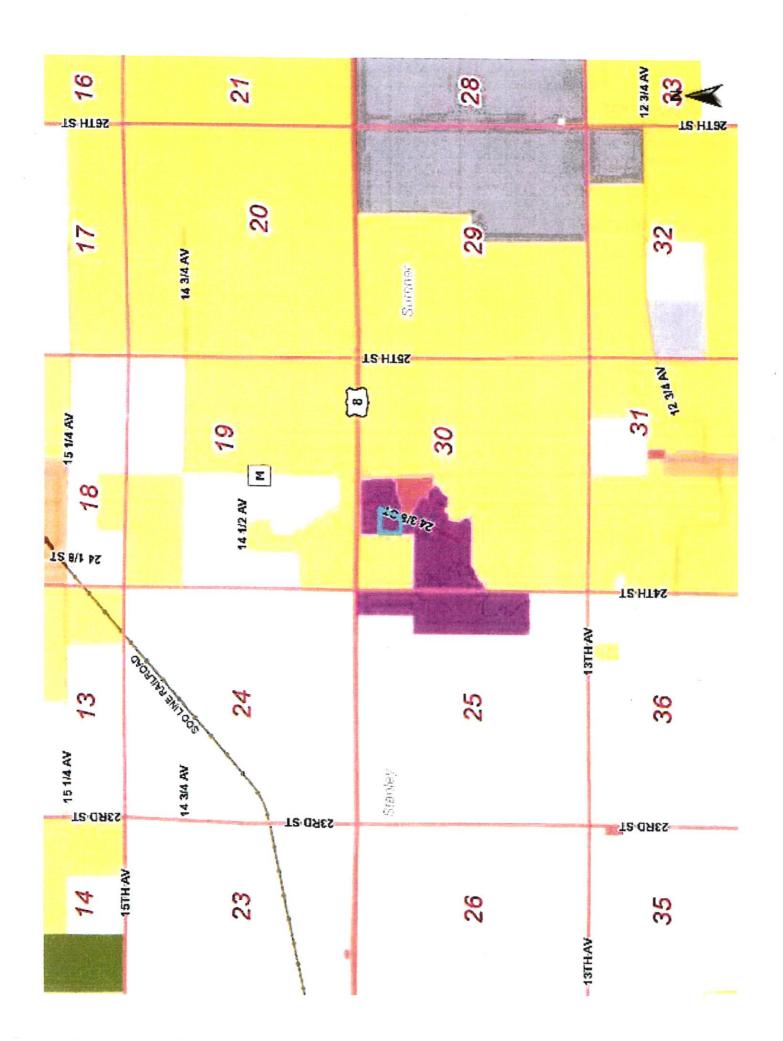

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Barron County increases juror per diem to \$100 per day

Jurors in Barron County will receive double the daily pay beginning Sept. 1, 2025, as the Board of Supervisors voted 27-0 to raise the per diem to \$100 for a full day and \$50 for a part day.

The change originated during preparations for the county's 2026 budget. Clerk of Court Sharon Millermon noted that the \$50 full-day and \$25 part-day rates had been in place for 19 years and recommended an increase. Millermon and Presiding Judge James Babler submitted the proposal to County Administrator Jeff French, who supported the idea and suggested implementing it sooner. The Executive Committee then advanced the recommendation to the full board.



"We were so very happy for the unanimous support from the County Administrator,

Executive Committee, and County Board from the get-go. We are by no means a rich county, but we do appreciate our jurors," Millermon said.

"It is indeed fitting that the Board increased the per diem on September 1st when September is Jury Appreciation Month," Judge Babler said.

"Our jurors sacrifice much to perform their civic duty to serve. We know that the increase does not cover all the financial costs of serving, but we hope it makes it easier to fulfill their duty."

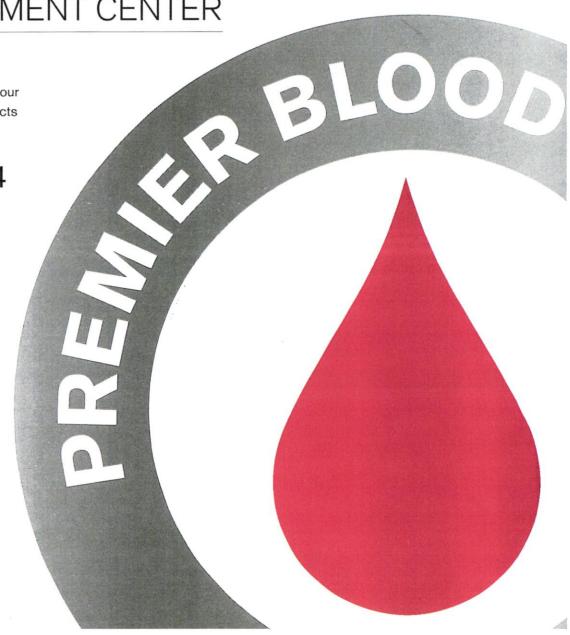

What are Equalized Values?



While it is the local assessor's responsibility to discover, list, and value each taxable real estate parcel, the assessed values are not required to be at market value and cannot be used to apportion taxes for overlying

taxing jurisdictions. It is the Wisconsin Department of Revenue's responsibility to determine the equalized value, which is the estimated taxable value of all real property in each municipality, by property class, as of January 1, and certified by DOR on August 15 of each year. The equalized value creates fair apportionment of tax levies between municipalities that lie within an overlying taxing jurisdiction. Examples of overlying taxing jurisdictions include school districts, counties, technical schools, and special districts whose budgets are funded from local property taxes. New in 2025!

Assessment Compliance

Beginning in November 2025, the Wisconsin Department of Revenue (DOR) will send advisory notices to municipalities that have been non-compliant with state law (sec. 70.05(5), Wis.

Stats.) for three consecutive years. The purpose of this notice is to increase communication between DOR and local municipal officials and encourage earlier planning for revaluations, including budgeting and contracting with an assessor.

Top 10 Largest Increases

Below lists the top 10 largest increases in equalized value for a five-year period.

Each five-year period corresponds to pre-pandemic and post-pandemic market changes reflected in the equalized value.

The post-pandemic data shows an increased demand for recreational property had a strong influence on real estate values in the top 10 counties.

2025 Equalized Values - Wisconsin property values maintain growth

Wisconsin's 2025 total equalized value as of January 1, 2025, is \$982.8 billion, an increase of over \$75.4 billion (8.31%) from the prior year.

- \$15.2 billion due to new construction (2%)
- \$60.5 billion due to market value increases (8%)

Although an 8% increase represents an historically strong increase, it is a relatively moderate increase compared to 2022 and 2023, which had increases greater than 13%. Significant increases in equalized value have an immediate impact on assessment compliance under state law (sec. 70.05(5), Wis. Stats.), which requires a municipality's assessed value of major classes of property to be within 10% of full value once every five years. A rapidly increasing real estate market often means municipalities may be non-compliant immediately following a revaluation year, shortening the time between required revaluations. Municipalities

and assessors should monitor their compliance status closely, and plan for the resources needed to complete a revaluation according to the required timeframe.
