Meeting called to order by Judge James Babler at 12:00 p.m. Motion Millermon/Evenson to approve agenda. Motion French/Vogel to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Babler presented data reports. Steffens/Keenen presented probation report. Coordinator presented OAR Diversion report. Council discussed.

Sheriff Jodi Kummet introduced to council.

Future agenda items: Competency Subcommittee Update in early 2026.


Motion Millermon/Kummet to adjourn meeting. Meeting adjourned at 12:51 pm.


Barron County Average Daily Population Comparison




Barron County 2025 Average Daily Population




Barron County September 2025 Jail Roster Summary




Barron County September 2025 Bail Jumping Charges






Barron County October 2025 Bail Jumping Charges










Barron County December 2025 Bail Jumping Charges




Barron County 2026 Average Daily Population




Barron County January 2026 Jail Roster Summary




Barron County January 2026 Bail Jumping Charges






Barron County February 2026 Bail Jumping Charges







Barron County 2026 Hold Over Summary



In September 2025, 62 cases were closed. Of those cases, 14 defendants were sentenced to probation in 15 cases and three defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. One defendant is eligible for expunction.

Of the 15 cases:

- 1 defendant ordered one year of probation
- 9 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 5 defendants ordered four years of probation

In October 2025, 74 cases were closed. Of those cases, 19 defendants were sentenced to probation in 20 cases and four defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. One defendant is eligible for expunction.

Of the 20 cases:

- 6 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 11 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 3 defendants ordered four years of probation

In November 2025, 51 cases were closed. Of those cases, 11 defendants were sentenced to probation in 11 cases and three defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. Three defendants are eligible for expunction.

Of the 11 cases:

- 4 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 5 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 2 defendants ordered three years of probation

In December 2025, 57 cases were closed. Of those cases, 13 defendants were sentenced to probation in 14 cases and two defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision.

Of the 14 cases:

- 4 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 5 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 5 defendants ordered three years of probation

In January 2026, 88 cases were closed. Of those cases, 25 defendants were sentenced to probation in 29 cases and one defendant were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. Two defendants are eligible for expunction.

Of the 29 cases:


- 8 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 13 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 6 defendants ordered three years of probation
- 2 defendant ordered four years of probation

In February 2026, 65 cases were closed. Of those cases, 18 defendants were sentenced to probation in 20 cases and five defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision.


Of the 20 cases:

- 2 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 1 defendant ordered 18 months of probation
- 11 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 6 defendants ordered three years of probation


Barron County Probation Term Comparison




Barron County September 2025 Probation Case Summary











Inmate Crime Classification





Inmate Crime Classification












