Future agenda items: Probation update. Housing update.

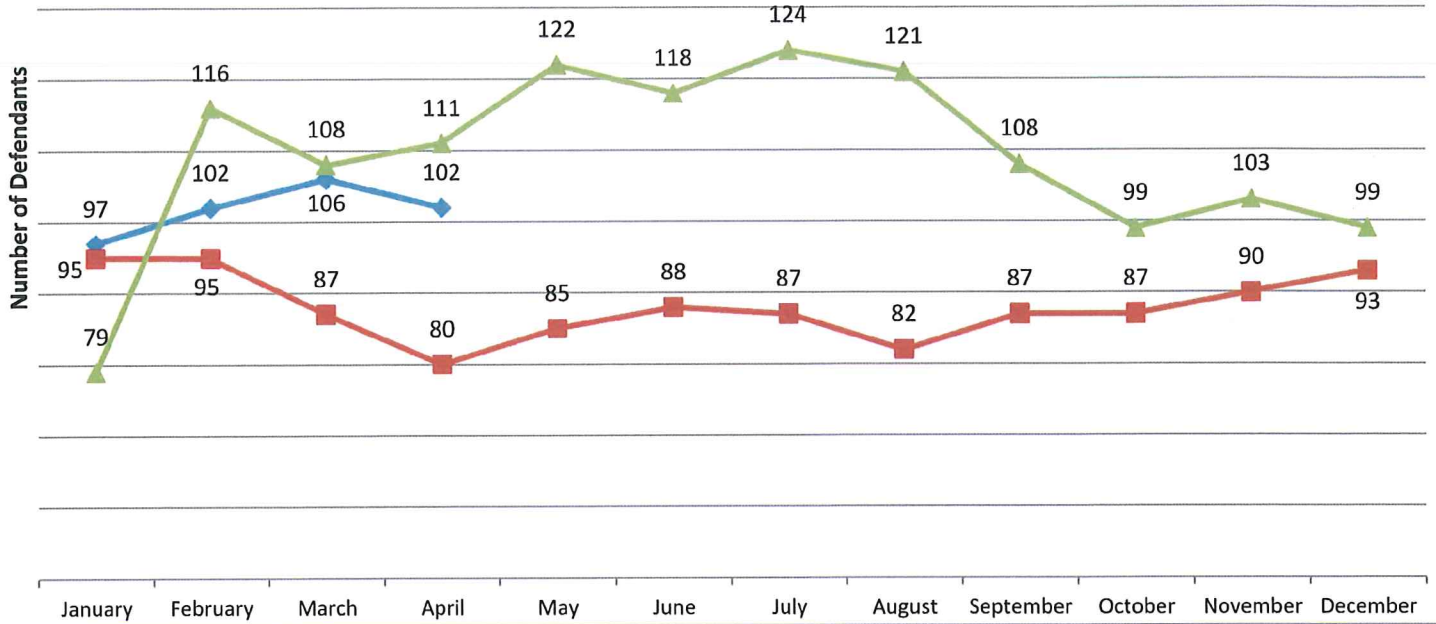
Motion French/Millermon to adjourn meeting. Meeting adjourned at 12:34 pm.

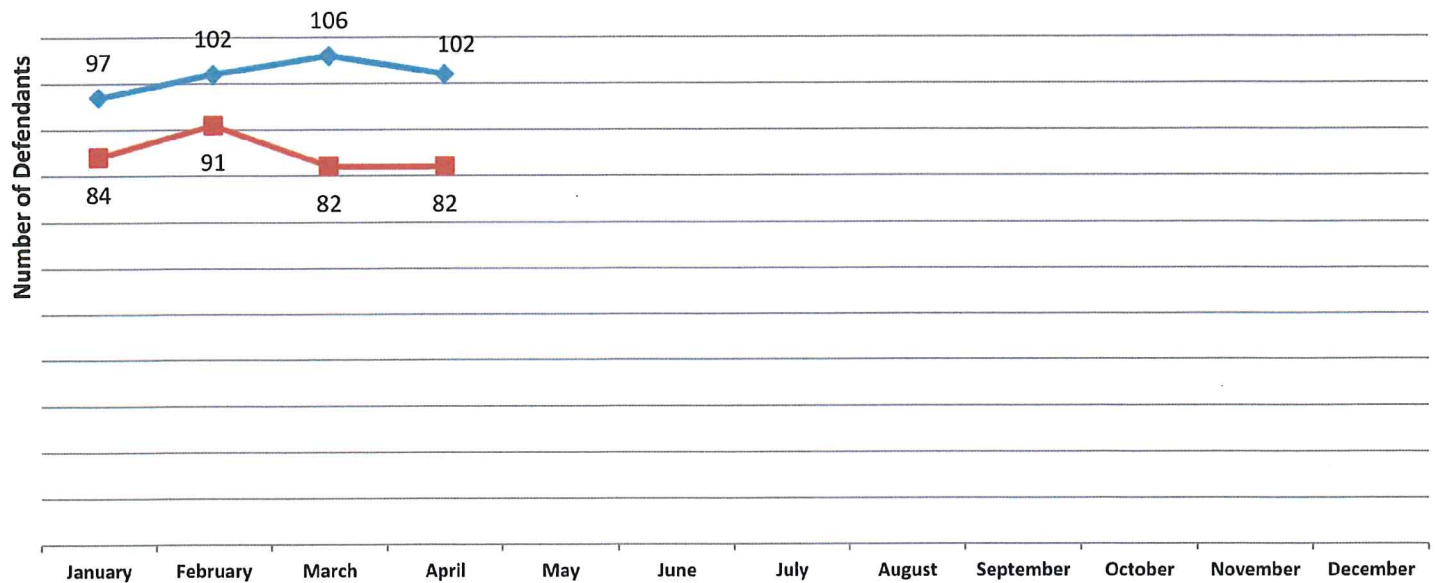
Barron County Average Daily Population Comparison

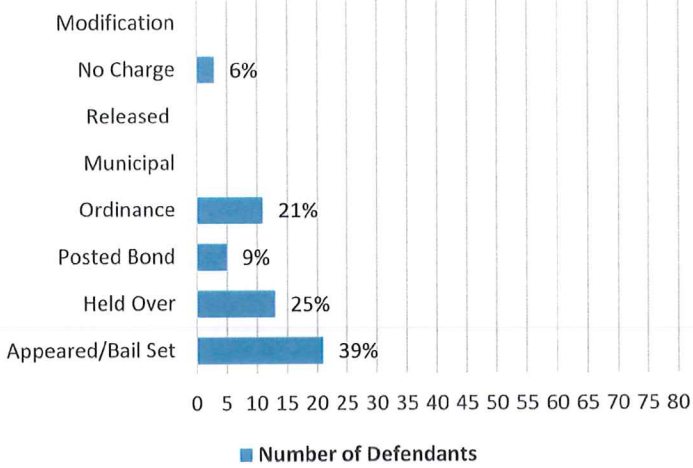


Barron County 2026 Average Daily Population

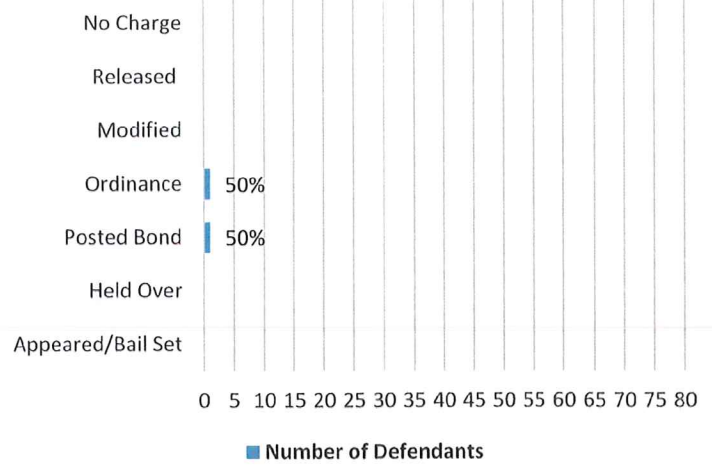

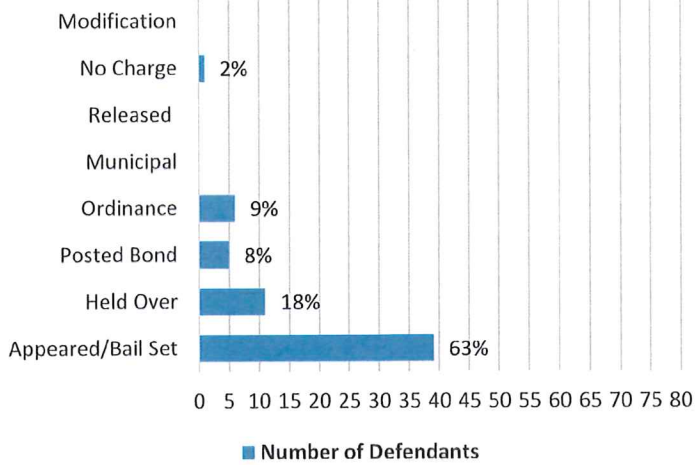
Barron County March 2026 Jail Roster Summary



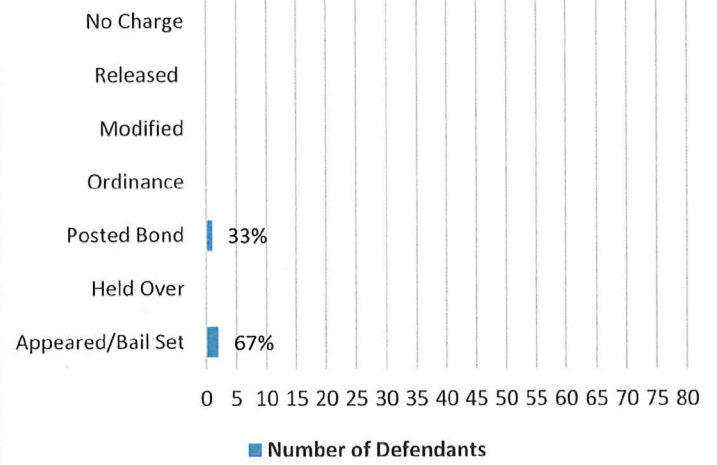
Barron County March 2026 Bail Jumping Charges



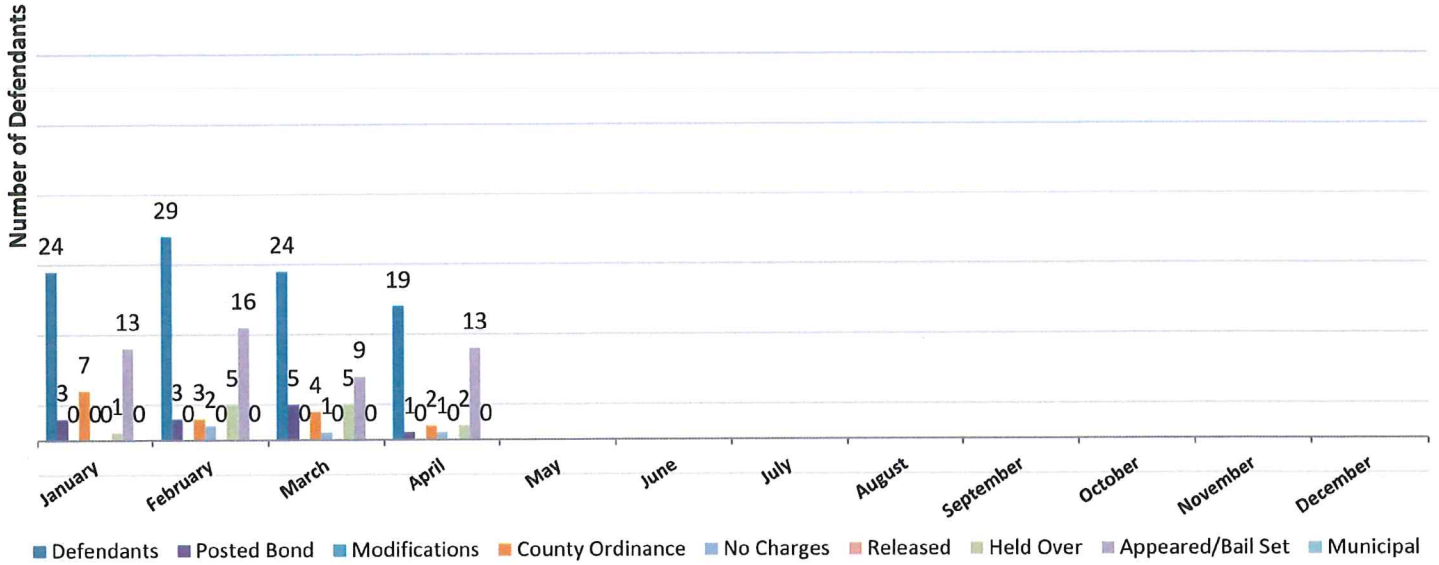

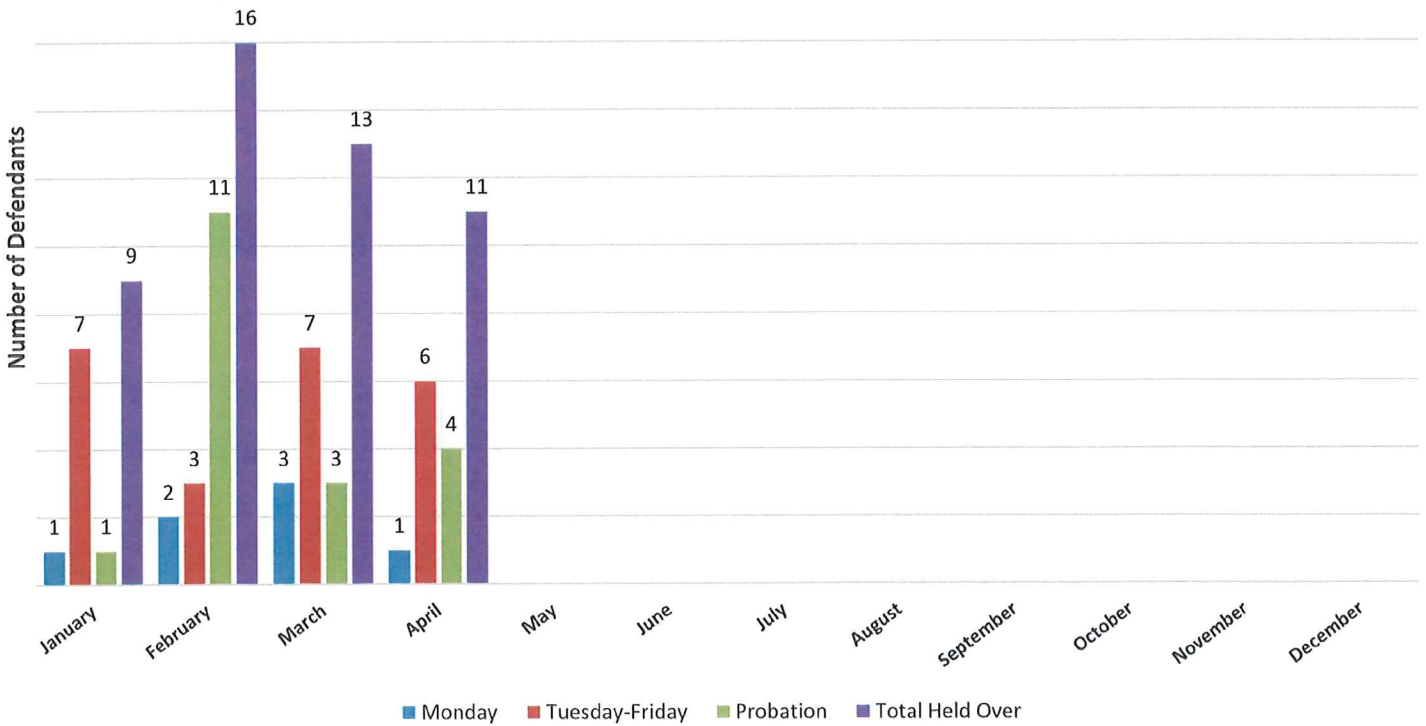
Barron County April 2026 Bail Jumping Charges

Barron County 2026 Hold Over Summary



In March 2026, 60 cases were closed. Of those cases, 12 defendants were sentenced to probation in 14 cases and two defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. One defendant is eligible for expunction.

Of the 14 cases:

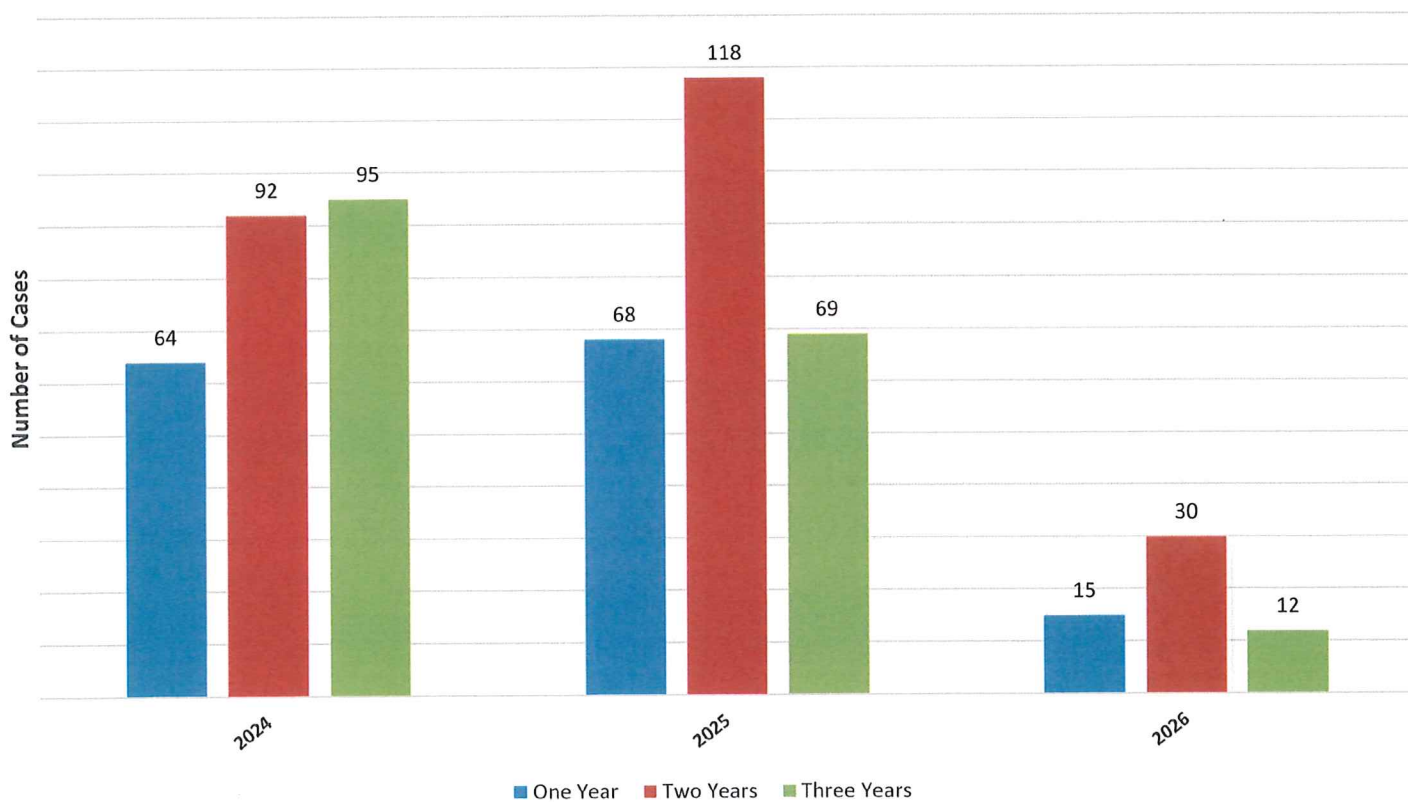
- 2 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 8 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 2 defendants ordered three years of probation
- 1 defendant ordered four years of probation
- 1 defendant ordered five years of probation

In April 2026, 75 cases were closed. Of those cases, 18 defendants were sentenced to probation in 19 cases and five defendants were sentenced to prison with extended supervision. Three defendants are eligible for expunction.

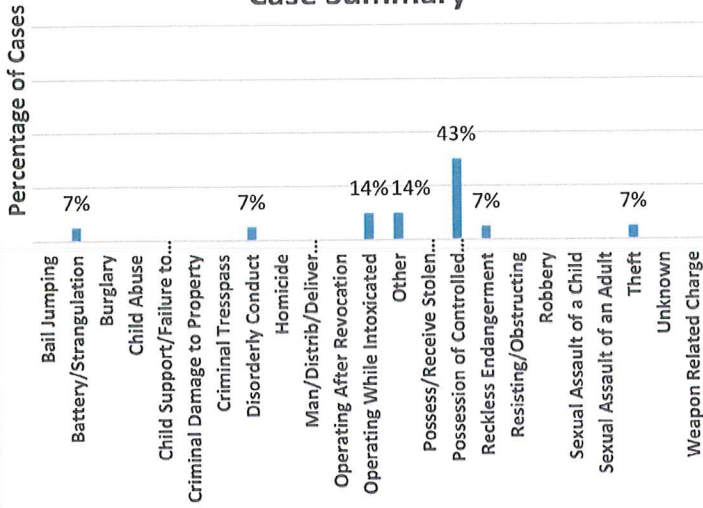
Of the 19 cases:

- 5 defendants ordered one year of probation
- 1 defendant ordered 18 months of probation
- 9 defendants ordered two years of probation
- 4 defendants ordered three years of probation

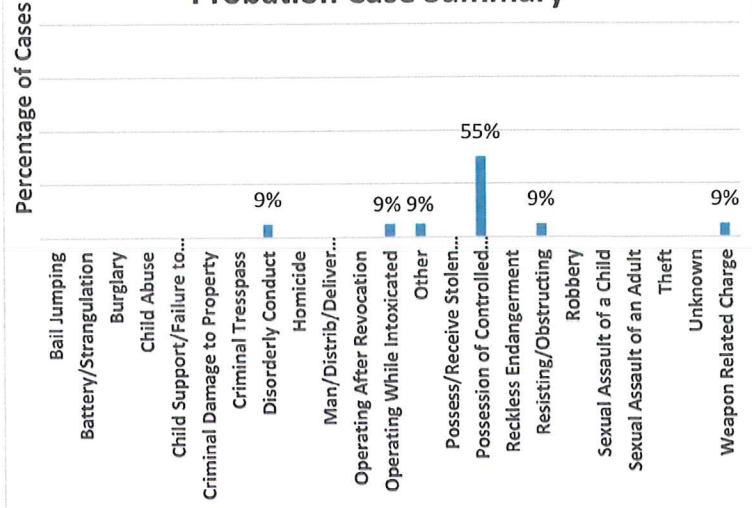
Barron County Probation Term Comparison



Barron County March 2026 Probation Case Summary



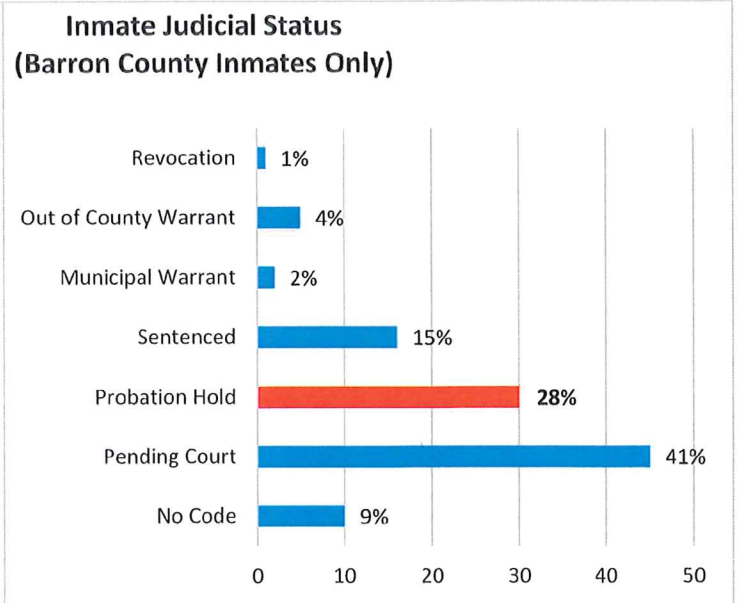
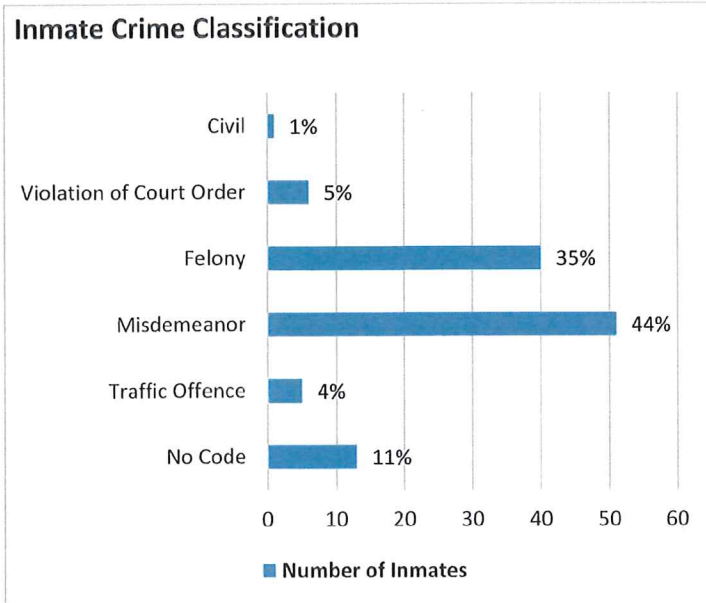
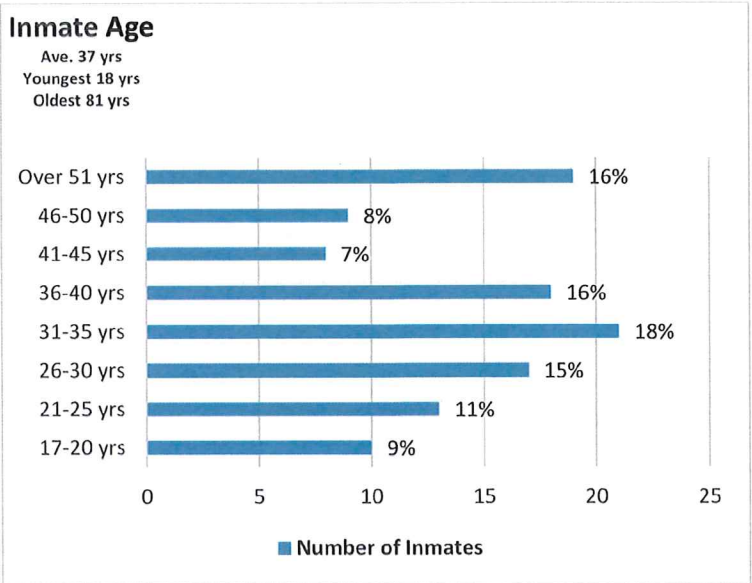
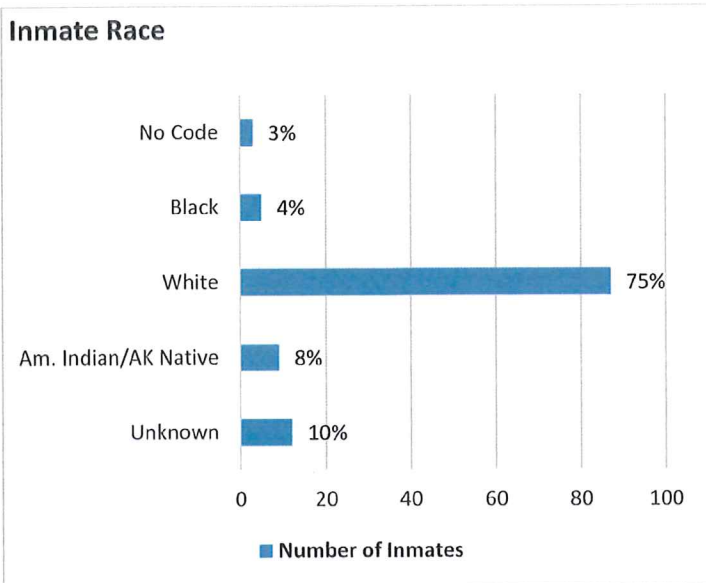
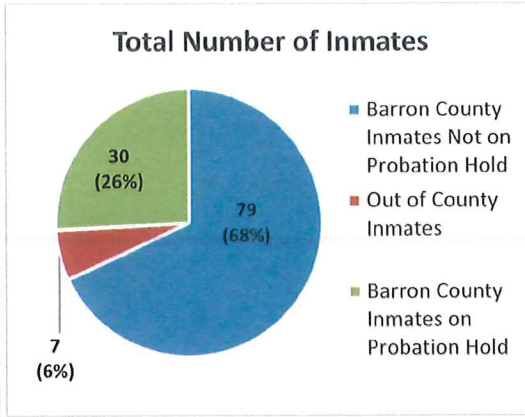
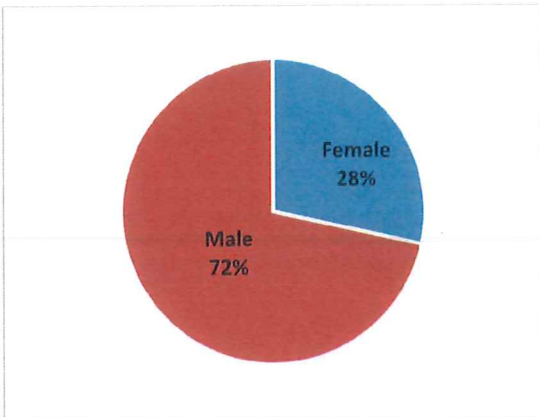
Barron County April 2026 Probation Case Summary

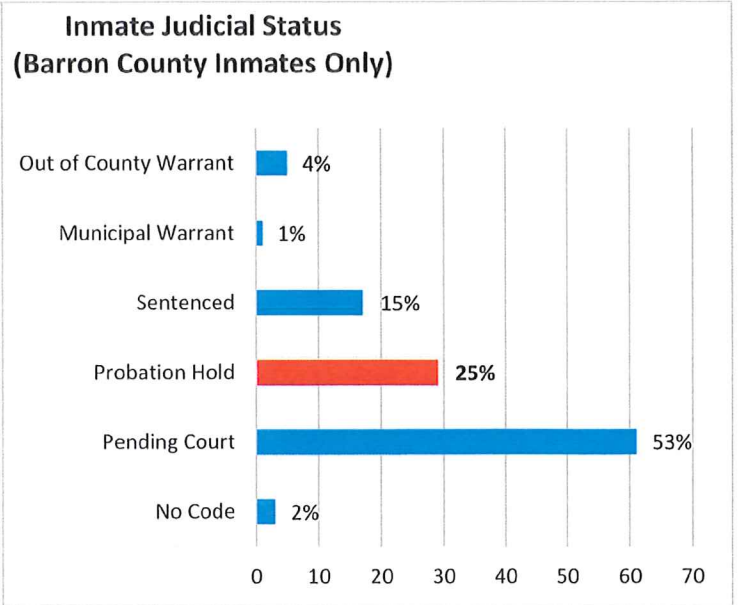

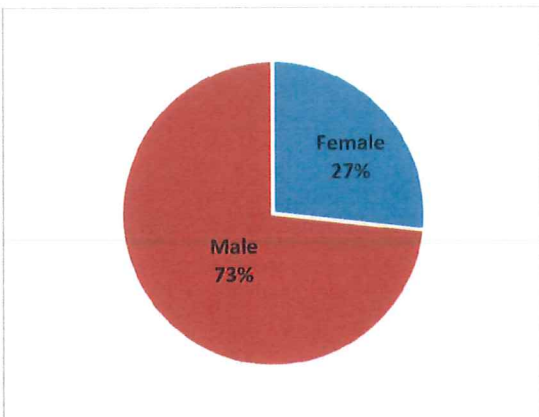
